At the time, it was one of the best origami books ever written.But origami grew up quickly; those looking for an introduction to the subject would do better with a more modern approach, like those by Megumi Biddle, Michael LaFosse, or John Montroll. Some of these models still meet modern standards-- and that is a wonder, given that they are almost 50 years old-- but most will seem awkward and oversimplified.
