The two main plots are resolved in the fourth novella, but as this is a continuing series, a number of subplots will continue to be developed in further books.These are the voyages of the starship Excalibur. Its ongoing mission: to head over to the ruined Thallonian Empire and try to sort out whatever messes they come across.House of Cards: This basically introduces the crew and provide background on them, and set up the basic scenerio. Guest starring Spock and a few Next Generation characters who will not be in the rest of this book.Into the Void: More character background. The Excalibur heads towards Thallonian space. The seeds of the two plots of the next novella are shown. Sown?The Two-front War: Well, not so much a war; more like two plots going on at the same time. Zak Kebron and Si Cwan check out a distress call. The Excalibur resettles 48 refugees on the planet Nelkar. Naturally, neither of these situations are as innocuous as they seem.End Game: The two plots are resolved.In this book, you will see people behave in manners you would not

normally see in Star Trek, in situations you would not normally see in Star Trek. If this idea appeals to you, the series is quite entertaining, at least so far. I have just begun reading it for the first time myself. If you've read Peter David before, you'll see the same witty humor you've come to expect from him. 4 stars because although it's a good start, there's still room for improvement. (A bird? Really?).
