(If you want an encyclopedia of origami, buy something like Eric Kenneway's excellent "Complete Origami". That's a real encyclopedia with models to make and an alphabetical listing so you can easily look up topics of interest.) And secondly, this book is EXACTLY the same as many of Rick Beech's other titles. It also appears titled: "Practical Origami", "Origami: The Complete Practical Guide to the Ancient Art of Paperfolding" and "The Origami Handbook". They are all the SAME content with minor differences in book size. The book itself is not bad. I just don't know why this version is misleadingly called an encyclopedia when it's not. Or why we need four copies of this book all with different names. One would surely be plenty.
